Can reading comic books improve your photography?

This was the subject of a curious article I came across the other day. Turns out it can, by the way. Take a moment to think about it;

- the individual panels, or frames, help graphically to tell complex storylines
- the panels are each eye-catching mastering perspective, colour, tone and composition
- the minimal text is carefully chosen, placed not to impede the story's flow, all excess removed
- light is carefully used to create mood
- the author is acutely aware of expressions and body language to properly convey the mood

You're probably thinking of comics as something the kids will grow out of sooner rather than later. But consider some of the recent movies and TV aimed as much at adults that are based on comics including Batman, Men In Black, Sin City, Watchmen and the TV zombie drama 'The Walking Dead'

Comic books, or graphic novels, have a highly developed narrative style that combines minimal text with a succession of still images and it is the strength of these still images (panels) that makes a comic successful – they complete a narrative really only hinted at by the text used.

So next time you are in a bookshop, take some time to look through a comic book or graphic novel. Study how the images have been created and think about the 'completeness' of each panel and how it conveys the message. You might just discover enjoying comics for their own sake as well!

Aliah Jan Workshop

We have been fortunate to secure the skills of Aliah Jan FPSNZ who will run a workshop for us on producing AV's, and the use of Adobe Lightroom for processing images. This will include a shoot in the afternoon and some sort of group dinner (to be decided, maybe fish & chips?)

Aliah will be partnered with her friend Leonie who will run a small section on pinhole photography. The programme is:

- 2-3ish Aliah to introduce & share on AV production
- 3 5ish delegates to shoot photos & bring back for post processing
- 5 6ish post processing with LR4
- 6-630/7 Shared meal (either BYO or takeaways) (format to be confirmed here)
- 7 830/9 Workshops either AV production with Aliah or pinhole with Leonie

What to Bring:

- 1. Your Camera
- 2. Some images you would like to work on
- 3. A laptop with a post production programme loaded (e.g. Lightroom; Picassa, Photoshop etc) If you have one. If you haven't a laptop then bring images on a flash drive as there will be others who will have a laptop available to help you.
- 4. An expectation to have fun and be inspired.

Please contact Keith or Geoff if you intend to attend the workshop as we need to organise some numbers before the day. Costs will be split amongst the attendees and are estimated to be \$10-20 per person, plus dinner (takeaways?)

- size your images to a maximum of 1024 x 768 pixels,
- label your images with an appropriate name, your grade and initials *i.e. myphoto_a_cp.jpg*
- send Theme and Open images as separate emails,
- and ensure either '(month) Theme' or '(month) Open' is in the subject line of your email.

Next Theme

The set theme for September is: 'Black & White Interiors - Viewing your indoor world in black and white'. Theme and Open images are due Monday 10^{th} September for the meeting on the 11^{th} .

Also due is the third Open Print of the year. Bring your mounted image along to the meeting.
