		Submit entries for Print of the Year: This should be your very best Open image taken during the year and printed for this competition; matted and maximum size 12 x 8" or A4 for judging.
		Submit entries for the Floral and Landscape Cups: These should be your very best Floral and Landscape images taken during the year and printed for this competition; matted and maximum size 12 x 8" or A4 for judging.
		Prepare your End of Year Theme: (Submit at the December Christmas Meeting) Minimum of six shots taken through the year to a theme of your own choice. A successful set will have a strong relationship between all the images. These should be presented in an informal, creative, artistic manner. There are no rules on images size or presentation here.

## 2014 Submission Requirements

Please note the following information for submitting images for critique in the monthly image submissions. These are to minimise the work-load for those organising the critiques of the images.

Theme Digital images are to be submitted for on-screen critique. You may submit 2 digital images via email per month.

Open Digital images are to be submitted for on-screen critique. You may submit 1 digital image via email per month.

Open Print images are to be submitted printed & matted. You may submit 1 open print every 3 months.

## **PSNZ** guidelines specify:

Digital images are to be in the *.jpg* file type sized to a maximum of 1620 px on the horizontal side and 1080 pixels on the vertical side (at 72 dpi). If it's an option in your software, set the JPEG quality to 100%. Images do not have to be 1620 x 1080 px exactly but must fit within these maximum dimensions. With crops such as panorama landscapes you could have an image 1620px wide but only 640px high, or a square crop of 1080 x 1080 pixels.

Prints must be presented in a matte frame with a maximum size of  $50 \times 40$  cm. To minimise costs we suggest keeping to a print size of  $12 \times 8$  inches, or A4. Presentation of the print and cardboard matte is taken into consideration for critique as well as the image itself so take care with your presentation.

Both digital files and prints should be named with your grade, a picture title befitting the image, plus the initials of your name so we can identify the photographer, i.e. *b\_sunset-on-rakiura\_cp.jpg*. Depending on the judge, appropriate titles may constitute a significant proportion of the critique/points.

All pictures must have been shot within 12 months of the submission date and may only be submitted once for one category, with the exception of submissions for SixWays and the End Of Year competitions for the December meeting.

Digital Theme and Digital Open images are to be sent in separate emails with either '*Theme*' or '*Open*' clearly written in the email's subject line so we can identify the correct category for them. The email address for entries is <u>photos@matamatacameraclub.org</u> Images sent to other email accounts (such as committee members private email accounts) will not be accepted.

Digital entries must be received no later than 6pm on the Monday prior to the meeting please.

## No full size digital photos! Please ensure you resize them correctly before emailing.

Open prints are to be submitted at the month's meeting or prior to this by special arrangement with the Judging Convener if you cannot make the meeting.

Points from external judging of both the set themes and open images will be awarded for participation as well as critique. These will be accumulated towards winning an award at the end of the year. Points are awarded as follows;

Honours	5 Points
Highly Commended	4 Points
Merit	3 Points
Accepted	2 Points
Entry/Not Accepted	No points

Each month's images are critiqued with the results available at the following months meeting. Non-Accepted images may be resubmitted in following months.

End of year prizes will be awarded to the person(s) with the highest points in the Theme, Open and Combined points sections.
